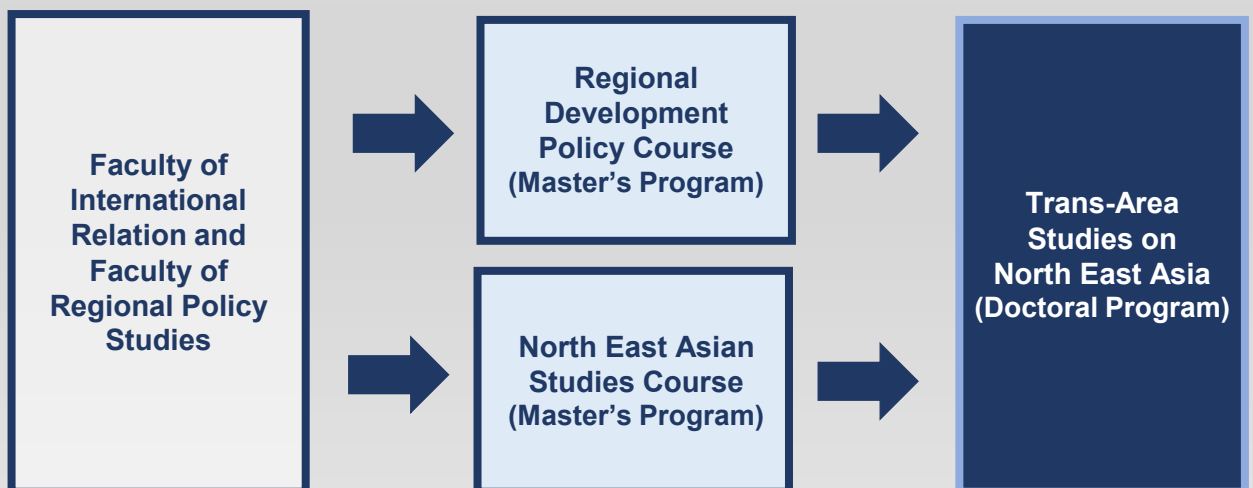
Nurture the Ability to Plan for a Better Community

Students will learn practical and specific subjects with practitioners while analyzing natural resources and historical culture in the region. Students will acquire the ability to plan and implement projects.



Graduate School of North East Asian and Development Studies

The Graduate School of North East Asia and Development Studies offers a Master's Program in North East Asian Studies, a Master's Program in Regional Development Policy, and a Doctoral Program in Trans-Area Studies on North East Asia. The North East Asian Studies program and North East Asia and Trans-Area Studies program focus on regional studies in North East Asia, including China, North and South Korea, Mongolia, Russia, and Japan. The school conducts research on a trans-regional level. This is much more than a simple collection of individual studies on each region. The North East Asian region has been built through multi-lateral interaction between people and exchange of commodities. As we look to the future, globalization and internationalization of each region progresses. It is imperative to conduct interdisciplinary studies surpassing the framework of individual fields such as the humanities and social sciences. The Regional Development Policy program conducts interdisciplinary studies on issues relating to various fields of regional development while utilizing a diverse range of social sciences, including economics, politics, sociology, law and anthropogeography. Special attention is given to policy issues relating to declining birth rates, aging society, depopulation, decentralization, regional economic stimulus, and development of mountainous areas. These issues are serious concerns in Shimane Prefecture and the rest of Japan. They have not only surfaced as policy issues in Japan, but in North East Asia as well. By resolving these issues, it will be possible to contribute to the North East Asian region. Though the graduate school centers on individual research conducted by students, members also receive detailed guidance from their professors and other faculty as well.



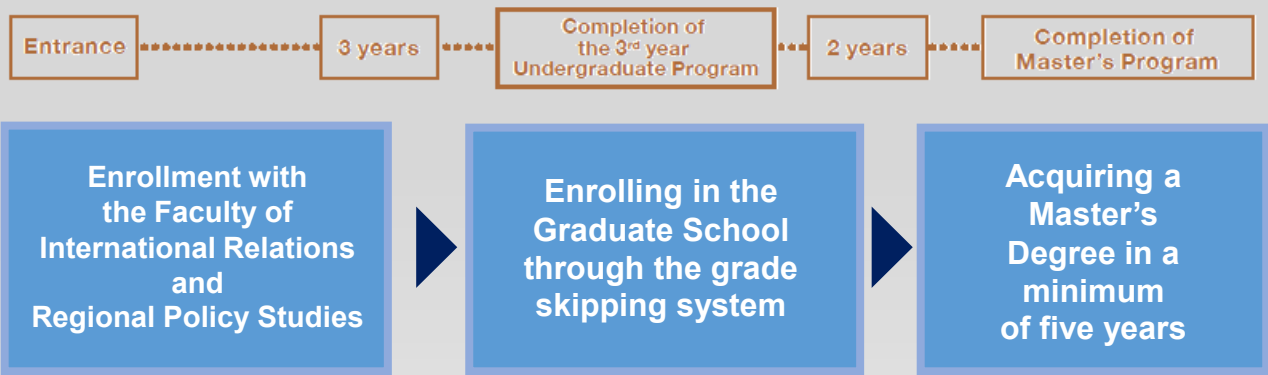


Developing graduates who can play active roles in the new era of North East Asia

Along with the development of globalization and an information society, exchanges between people and of ideas are more widespread across borders. We can now feel globalization more closely. On the other hand, such problems as aging populations declining populations and regional disparities which are found in Shimane Prefecture are emerging as common issues across North East Asia. The Graduate School of North East Asia and Development Studies, the University of Shimane, is developing research and education that corresponds to such changes.
